ISSBS is the coordinator of **the international project Inclusion of Roma and Migrants in Schools:**

**Trainings, Open Discussions and Youth Volunteering Activities (RoMigSc).** The project involves partners from Germany, Italy, Spain, Macedonia and Turkey. Within the frame of the project a **national consultation on the project is organised with interested stakeholders** in each partner country each year (2017, 2018, 2019). **The first consultation in Slovenia is in Celje, in further years, we plan to organize consultations in Koper and Ljubljana.**

- The main aim of the RoMigSc project is to support a better integration of Roma and migrant children in education through various activities that stimulate innovative policy development, policy dialogue and implementation, as well as the exchange of knowledge in the fields of education, training and youth.
- Although (multicultural) diversity is an opportunity to make schools more inclusive, creative and open-minded, inequality in education is the highest among Roma and migrant children. For instance, this group is more likely to drop out from compulsory education, leading to higher risks of social marginalization, to a failure to integrate and, ultimately, to poverty, which has long-term adverse effects on the social development and economic growth of the host country.
- The engagement of youth in volunteering is fostered in the project. Volunteering plays a significant role in youth's social inclusion. It allows youngsters to engage as citizens, as well as to gain experience, which can enhance their employment opportunities.
- Target groups:
  - Teachers in schools with Roma and migrant children, Roma school assistants;
  - Volunteers (students);
  - Stakeholders: policy-makers in the area of education, representatives from local authorities, volunteering organizations, directors of schools at different levels, academics and researchers in the area, etc;
  - Migrant and Roma children and their parents.
