# 1 The preparation phase of the training

## 1.1 Development of the program (January - February 2019)

In the planning and in the delivery of the programme 2019, we also involved Slovenian Philanthropy; the same way as we had done in 2018 (*Slovenian Philanthropy is the central organisation focusing on development, promotion, and coordination of volunteering activities in Slovenia*).

The detailed structure and schedule of the event can be seen from the invitations written in the Slovene language (see <https://bit.ly/2TkfEtY>). Besides, the promotion was also done through a poster campaign (see poster <https://bit.ly/2EmeVyF>).

The content of the training for volunteers, which was delivered as a highly interactive workshop, was structured as follows:

- 1) Volunteering for the social integration of disadvantaged social groups
- 2) Youth and volunteering in Slovenia
- 3) Experience of volunteers
- 4) Overcoming stereotypes and multiculturalism
- 5) Methods of solving and preventing unforeseen situations when contacting people from different cultural backgrounds
- 6) Ways of volunteering for the effective integration of immigrant children into schools
- 7) International experience: volunteering as a challenge for students

At the beginning of the event, the project RoMigSc was presented. At the end of the event, the current results of the project were disseminated and explained as well as planning meeting with volunteers and volunteers' mentors from school was organised.

## 1.3 Invited participants

- Volunteers (students)
- Representatives from hosting schools involved in the project
- Students from ISSBS (enrolled in the course Social Responsibility and Volunteering)

The invitations for the events were sent individually to the volunteers as well as to the ISSBS students and schools involved in the project. Besides e-mail advertising, we advertised the training (together with volunteering activities) also through posters, Facebook, through the



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portal of Slovenian Philanthropy, info Direct Points, Students' Associations, etc. Participants registered for the event through our electronic system available at <http://mfdps.1ka.si/a/640?language=1>

#### **1.4 E-classroom (open access)**

Before the implementation of the training, we prepared an open e-classroom available for all without any password. The materials will be available also in the future and possibly used in further project's activities.



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## 2 Training delivery

**9-00–10-30:** Introductory address and welcome presentation of the RoMigSc project. Volunteering as part of the study, and enhancement of the values of solidarity through activation of youth (Dr. Nada Trunk Širca, Dr. Valerij Dermol)

**10.30–10.45:** Definition of volunteering in Slovenia and the importance of mentoring for organized volunteering (Mr. Jaka Matičič)

**10.45–11.00:** Volunteering (volunteering for integration, youth, and volunteering in Slovenia, etc.) (Mr. Jaka Matičič)

**11.00–12.30:** Workshop Stigma (experience of volunteers, overcoming stereotypes, etc.) (Mr. Jaka Matičič)

**13.30–14.00:** Workshop ethical codex of organized volunteering (methods for solving unpredictable situations, volunteer experiences, etc.) (Mr. Jaka Matičič)

**15.30–16.00:** Presentation of e-classroom and materials RoMigSc (concepts, contents, etc.) and getting feedback from participants (Dr. Valerij Dermol).

**16.00–16.45:** Presentation of the situation regarding the inclusion of Roma and migrants in Slovenia and good practices (international experience, volunteering for effective integration, etc.). Presentation of an initial study of project RoMigSc – current situation in the area: Main findings from initial study RoMigSc and synthesis report RoMigSc; Policy recommendations at local, national and EU level (Dr. Nada Trunk Širca, Dr. Valerij Dermol).

**16.45–18.00:** Discussion about the implementation of voluntary activities in schools (or other institutions) for the promotion of integration of immigrant and Roma children (Dr. Nada Trunk Širca, Dr. Valerij Dermol, Dr. Andrej Koren)

### 2.1 Some reports from the 2<sup>nd</sup> part of delivery (from 15.30 to 18.00)

The second part of the event was attended by participants of training and by 11 mentors of volunteers.

Further on we summarise the discussion/conclusions from the 2<sup>nd</sup> part of delivery.



In the introductory part was stressed role/importance of volunteering for reinforcement of solidarity. It was emphasised that through volunteering activities of project RoMigSc we look for synergies. The following contents were explained:

- By conducting 120 hours of volunteering, students can finish the elective course Social responsibility and volunteering, at bachelor level of education.
- Mentors will receive a certificate for being involved in the international project RoMigSc, and in this way, they can get points for promotion into titles (nationally regulated rules).
- Dr. Dermol presented the e-classroom and materials of RoMigSc. Participants were asked about their opinion on e-classroom and on the materials. In general, participants agreed that the e-classroom is very interactive, and offers a rich repository of documents. Besides, Dr. Dermol showed the e-platform which is an essential outcome of the project and is under construction at the moment. It will be developed on the basis of current e-classroom with added materials (reading and video) produced by the project's partners. The participants of the seminar also watched one of the videos explaining some of the goals and achievements of the RoMigSc project (the video is available at [https://youtu.be/AJlatFyRk\\_Y](https://youtu.be/AJlatFyRk_Y)).

Further on, we focused on the organisational aspects of volunteering in 2019. Below we summarise discussion/agreements:

- Mentors from schools shortly presented which volunteering activities are planned to be implemented in their schools in 2019.
- The newly developed forms for reporting of volunteering activities which will be done by the volunteers and the mentors were presented and discussed, as well as a diary of work for volunteers. Mentors gave some feedback on reports during the training/meeting and later by e-mails (*after receiving feedback from mentors, we prepared the final version of documents*). *The form is developed in electronic form to make the reporting as simple as possible.*
- In discussion with the mentors, we also asked them to take some photos at their events to be able to promote the project and the volunteering activities even in this way.
- During the event, it was also mentioned that ISSBS and IRŠIK are planning to organise supervisory visits to schools that are going to host the volunteers. Those visits will also be an opportunity for discussions with mentors, volunteers, and beneficiaries of volunteering and this way, additional feedback will be collected from the field. In case schools will consider that some events/activities may be of particular interest for the RoMigSc project, they were kindly asked to invite the project partners/coordinator to the events.
- At the end of the seminar, we established connections/linking between the volunteers who had still not been assigned to any school and recognised the schools that yet had not received any volunteers (*many connections between schools and volunteers had been established before the training took place*).



### 3 Evaluation of the training and policy recommendation

#### 3.1 Letter of thanks and evaluation questionnaire

A week after the training we sent to the speakers and to other participants the Letter of thanks, for their contribution and participation. Besides, we ask them to give us feedback through evaluation questionnaires. We also promised them to keep them informed about other activities in the future.

#### 3.2 Evaluation analysis

This report is based on the feedback provided by the participants and presenter/speakers who filled out the evaluation questionnaire. The surveys were sent out and filled out electronically using the system EnKlikAnketa provided by ISSBS. Altogether we collected 24 filled-out questionnaires which correspond to about 70% response rate.

##### 3.2.1 General characteristics of the seminars' participants

The average age of a respondent was 37.3 years (*the main reason for 'relatively high age' is that also the mentors participated*). The vast majority of the respondents were female (89%). Among the respondents, only one was also a presenter/speaker at the seminar.

Most of the participants were students. In the sample, there was 42% of students, 24% of social activists/volunteers and 16% of teachers. There were also 2 public administrators, 2 counsellors in schools, 1 head teacher and 1 social service employee ...

42% of the respondents already had some kind of experience in volunteering. 30% of respondents have previously worked with Migrant children, and 12% with Roma children.

**Napaka! Vira sklicevanja ni bilo mogoče najti.** Only 19% of participants had experience of using a particular method of Roma and migrant children integration in the learning environment.

54% of the respondents marked personal interest to be the most important trigger to attend the seminar; this was followed by a professional reason (32 %), and other reasons (14%).

##### 3.2.2 Satisfaction with a learning experience

The respondents seemed to be satisfied with the usefulness of the seminars. On the scale from 1 to 4, all the grades were between 3.3 and 3.7. The highest satisfaction was expressed in opportunities to Exchange of experiences with peers and colleagues; the lowest appreciation was shown with the materials in e-classroom.



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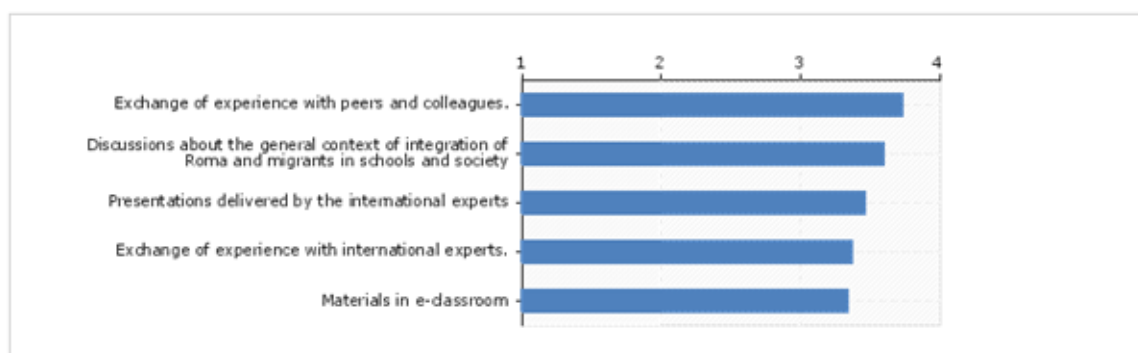
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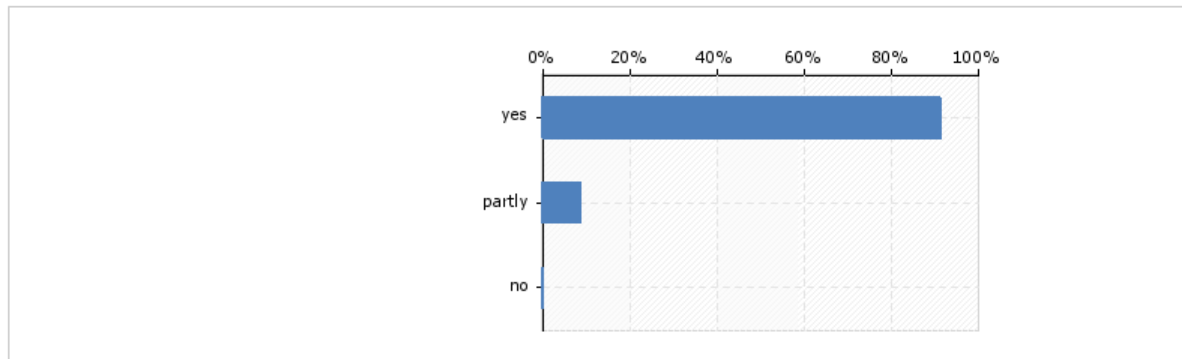
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Respondents reported a high level of interactivity of the seminars. The opportunities to express their suggestions and opinions was rated a bit higher than obtaining new knowledge in the event (92% vs. 84%).

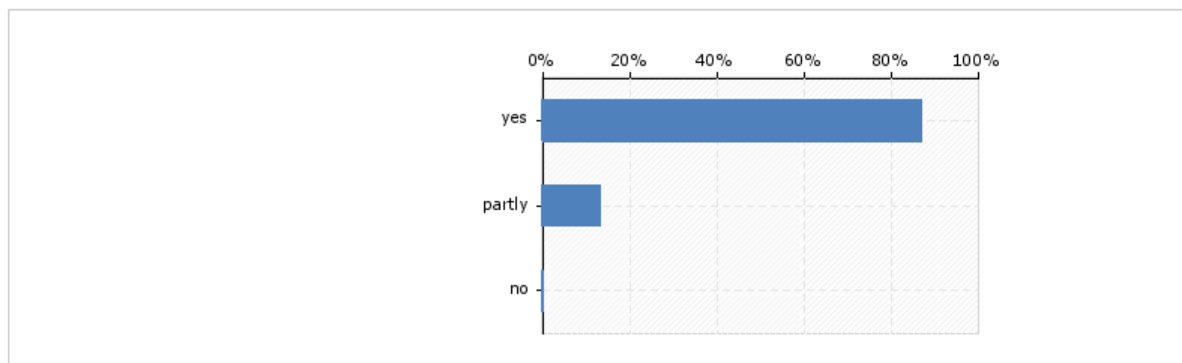
*Graph 1a: Assessment of the usefulness of the training*

### ***3.2.3 Significant advantages (of volunteers'/participants personality or experience) that they could apply in a multicultural class/environment; and Lessons learned at the seminar***

In the evaluation, we asked the participants about their most significant advantages (in their personality/experience) that they could apply in a multicultural class/environment. Here are the examples stated by the respondents:

- empathy, a joy to work with children, openness, and tolerance towards different nationalities, religion, etc.,
- personal experience of being a migrant,
- experiences of living in another country, among other cultures,
- understanding the Roma culture, and knowing the community of Roma,
- helping Migrant children to integrate through art,
- work experiences,
- self-initiative, proactive attitude.

We also asked the participants about the most valuable »lessons« they »learned« during the seminars. Here are the examples stated in the survey:

- exchange of opinions, and experiences, good practices, practical examples,
- topics on the demolition of stereotypes, prejudices,
- presentation of procedures of migrants for application for asylum,
- methods of work with vulnerable groups, how to behave as a volunteer.

### ***3.2.4 Suggestions for seminar and project improvements***

In the questionnaire there was quite some suggestion on how to improve the future events and the project as a whole:

- the workshop was great, practices well presented,
- it would be good to have guest migrants/Roma children, and to ask them what their needs are,
- the event was well organised, the contents were exciting, and participants well concentrated.

## **3.3 Policy recommendations**

- Availability of information about volunteering activities at schools should be improved at the national level. The idea which might be an a reasonable solution to this problem is so-called on-stop-point which could offer the possibility to concentrate all the information about the needs, the offer as well as good practices about the volunteering in the school environment.





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- Guests from different contexts should be invited to share their experience about the inclusion of different marginalised social groups. It seems that teachers at school lack knowledge about the migrant issue.
- Positive promotion about the achievements in the area of Roma and migrant inclusion in schools and dissemination of good practices should be encouraged and regularly implemented.
